# 1. Cookie Policy

## 1.1 What are Cookies?

A cookie is a small text file that a website stores in the user's browser (computer, tablet, mobile phone or similar device) when you visit the site. Cookies allow the website to remember information about your visit, such as your preferred language and other choices, which can make your next visit more convenient and the site more useful to you.

## 1.2 What do we use cookies for on our website?

We use cookies on our website for the following purposes:

- **Session management:** These cookies are essential for the operation of the website and allow us to keep your session active while you browse the different pages. Without these cookies, we would not be able to remember your previous actions within the session.
- **Language preferences:** We use a cookie to remember your language preference (English or Spanish) so that the page is automatically displayed in the language you selected on future visits.
- **Cookie consent management:** We use a cookie to remember whether you have accepted or declined the use of non-essential cookies. This allows us to show or not show you the cookie banner on your next visits.

Types of cookies we use:

- **Strictly necessary (essential) cookies:** These cookies are essential for you to be able to browse the website and use its basic functions. They include session cookies and the cookie that remembers your cookie consent decision. These cookies do not require your explicit consent under the regulations.
- **Functionality cookies (all):** These cookies allow the website to remember information about your choices (such as your preferred language) and provide enhanced and more personalised features.

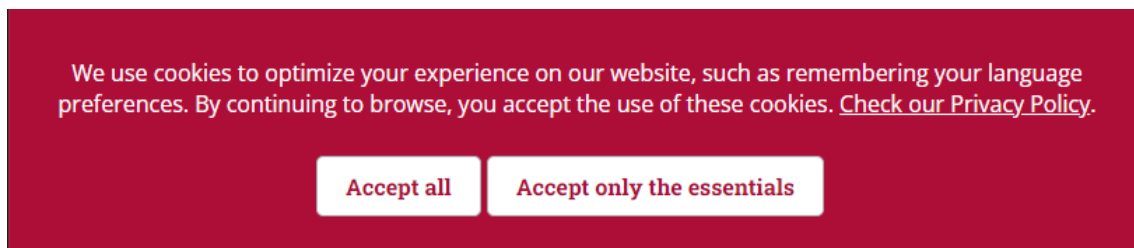
## 1.3 How long do cookies remain on your browser?

The length of time a cookie remains on your device may vary:

- **Session cookies:** These cookies exist only during your browsing session and are automatically deleted when you close your browser.
- **Persistent cookies:** These cookies remain on your device for a specific period of time (for example, the language preference cookie may last for several months) or until you manually delete them. The cookie that remembers your consent to cookies lasts for a four-month period (122 days).

## 1.4 How do I manage cookies?

You have the option of accepting or rejecting the use of non-essential cookies via the cookie banner shown to you on your first visit (Figure 1). If you wish to change your cookie preferences at any time, you can do so through your browser settings.

- Right of rectification: You can request correction of inaccurate personal data.
- Right of erasure (right to be forgotten): You can request the deletion of your personal data in certain circumstances.
- Right to restriction of processing: You may request restriction of the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances.
- Right to object: You may object to the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances.
- Right to data portability: You may request to receive your personal data in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format and to transfer it to another data controller.
- Right to withdraw consent: If the processing is based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time, without affecting the lawfulness of the processing based on the consent prior to its withdrawal.
